## CHANGES TO OCCUPANCY LAWS

For a couple of years, City Council, Planning Board and city staff have been working toward changing the occupancy laws to avoid discriminating against both non-traditional families and large extended families. Staff will soon be presenting to council a draft ordinance that would achieve those goals without allowing a wholesale increase in density.

It's important to note that the current rule limiting occupancy in a LR zone to three UNRELATED people will not change. The new ordinance should not affect how over-occupancy is enforced, and should not change how neighborhoods handle the issue of over-occupancy.

Can we ask our neighbors and their visitors to PLEASE park in front of their own houses and NOT in front of their neighbors' houses? ## NEW NOISE ORDINANCE

Boulder is rewriting its noise ordinances. The idea was to combine the three current ordinances into one and to reflect changes in the noise environment since the laws were written 20 years ago. Most provisions of the current law will remain. Important changes are:

- \* the definition of "unreasonable noise" will be relaxed somewhat in commercial zones (not in residential zones);

- \* sounds produced by the unaided human voice will be included along with electronically amplified sounds in the definition of unreasonable noise;

- \* business owners or managers will be held responsible for noise on their properties whether they are present or not;

- \* construction noise in residential zones will be limited a little.

The main thing is that the changes simplify the law and should improve enforcement.
