BREAKFAST IN THE PARK! That's a great way to start the day at MANA's annual neighborhood get-together on Saturday, September 7th, from 7:30 to 10:30 a.m., at the Martin Park Shelter. The breakfast is MANA's only fund-raiser. Tickets are \$2.50 for adults, and \$1.50 for seniors and kids under 12. City ordinance prohibits transaction of business in the park so on pancake day a ticket booth will be set up at the corner of Dartmouth and 38th Street, at the EAST entrance to the park.

TRANSPORTATION—AUTOMOBILE AND OTHERWISE...By all available indicators, the decision by the City Council not to create a boulevard on Table Mesa Drive (and demolish 18 homes in the process) was supported by a large majority of Martin Acres residents. But just not doing something does nothing to improve our traffic situation.

The City Director of Transportation, Philip Weisbach, and the director for alternative (to the auto) methods, Robert Whitson, take very seriously the stated City policy to reduce auto traffic. They are ready to recommend to City Council quite radical programs to achieve that policy. MANA leaders, in consultation with Mr. Whitson, have developed a questionnaire, attached to this copy of your *VOICE*, in order to survey attitudes of Martin Acres residents on autos and alternative modes of movement. We urge that you take a few minutes to fill out this survey sheet and turn it in as requested at the bottom of the front page, preferably when you come to enjoy the Pancake Breakfast.

Your opinion can have a real impact on improving Boulder's whole transportation system.

—**INCLUDING BICYCLE LANES ON MOORHEAD?**...John Hinkelman of the Transportation Department met with a number of residents living on Moorhead avenue and with the MANA Steering Committee to present a plan for marked bicycle lanes on Moorhead. The width of the street is such that automobile parking would have to be eliminated on the southwest curb to accommodate the bike lanes. The plan received a strong negative reaction from the residents attending the first meeting, and a mixed response from the Steering Committee. More meetings are scheduled for September and later, at which Mr. Hinkelman will attempt to address concerns voiced in the first meetings.
