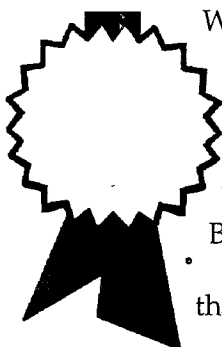


Busy Hands Awards

The discussion will take place after the board's 6:00 dinner in the city building on the SW corner of Canyon and Broadway. 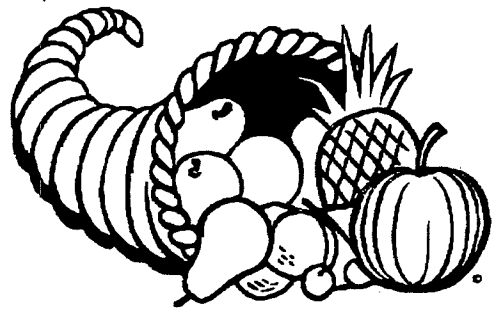
- Those nasty bullthorns at Martin Park Elementary will be sprayed come March next year. Don't say you didn't get a warning.

• The Paint-a-thon will probably be scheduled for the Spring at this point. Call Steve Altermatt for more information.



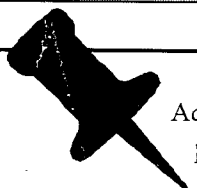
