IT'S ECO PASS SEASON AGAIN



Once again, Eco Pass season is upon us. Two districts with a total of 202 houses qualified last year, and we hope that by the time this newsletter arrives on your doorstep, they will have already qualified once again!

For those of you unfamiliar with the RTD Eco Pass Program, an Eco Pass is an unlimited bus pass for the RTD system, including all local and regional buses and the SkyRide. If you commute to work, or go to DIA, Denver and/or Eldora even a few times a year, the pass generally pays for itself pretty quickly. Thanks to GO Boulder, Eco Pass holders also receive a variety of discounts with local retailers, and Pettyjohn's Liquor and Baseline Liquor both offer special discounts to Martin Acres Eco Pass holders.

You can only get a Neighborhood Eco Pass if your block qualifies. To qualify, your block must raise a certain amount of money based on an average per household contribution and sign an Eco Pass Contract with RTD. Radon Testing Equipment is available for MA residents use. Contact Mark Stangl. My experience is that radon varies quit a bit due to season and local barometric conditions. I recommend two tests. One in the not heating and one in the closed house heating season. Each test should last a week with at least 2 days on outside air.

Washington School Petition Campaign The recent effort by the Washington School Neighborhood Association underscores the deep concerns the communities care about schools property and neighborhood development. This seems to be different than what Planning Board and some Council members have in mind for the future of Boulder. We will potentially have a similar issues with the old National Guard Fuel Depot Site on Table Mesa Drive. A redevelopment plan has been proposed but sent back for changes by the Planning Board due to design issues and neighbors inputs.
